



# Local2030 Coalition High Impact Initiative Special Event at the 2025 High-level Political Forum (HLPF)

### "Scaling up Local Innovation for Systemic SDG Impact"

## 16 July 2025 | 15:00-18:00 EDT | UN Headquarters, CR11 #SDGLocalization

#### **Background**

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted in 2015, serves as a comprehensive blueprint to eradicate poverty, protect the planet, and ensure prosperity for all. While significant strides have been made, persistent and interconnected global challenges—including climate change, armed conflict, economic disparities, and public health emergencies—continue to hinder collective progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

As global efforts continue to accelerate the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), there is an increasing emphasis on the power of localizing the SDGs, ensuring their implementation comes from the ground up and is rooted in co-created efforts, to foster impact and transformation. Sustainable development stakeholders increasingly recognize the transformative potential of SDG localization—a peoplecentered, locally-based approach that matches global aspirations into local realities, ensuring that sustainable development is inclusive, equitable, and deeply rooted in the experiences, capacities and leadership of local actors.

Within this context, the Local2030 Coalition, the United Nations platform on SDG localization comprised of 14 UN entities and five constituencies (national governments, local governments, civil society/academia, the private sector, and youth) will convene a Special Event at the 2025 High-Level Political Forum (HLPF). This event will reaffirm the centrality of SDG localization as a catalyst for systemic transformation and inclusive sustainable development.

Building on the progress and momentum generated through key impactful localization efforts, the event will bring together diverse partners and stakeholders to showcase concrete results and emerging practices that demonstrate the power of localization as a strategic lever for inclusive, sustainable development. This session will highlight how





local action, grounded in locally owned solutions, advances both subnational finance and the localization of the six transitions. From the Bilbao Blueprint and the Localization Marker, both supported by Spain and designed to embed subnational financing mechanisms from policy design through to implementation, to the operationalization of the High Impact Initiative (HII) on Localization from a wide ranging set of actors, it is clear that SDG localization is fostering the acceleration of impact in implementing the 2030 Agenda from the ground up.

By showcasing co-created multistakeholder innovation, strengthened multilevel governance, and local ownership of sustainable development, this event will demonstrate that local action is not only complementary to global agendas—it is fundamental to their success.

#### **Objectives**

The Local2030 Coalition Special Event will highlight how local action, grounded in cocreated territorial solutions, is accelerating impact across the six transitions.

The event will serve as a platform for the Local2030 Coalition and its partners to:

- Showcase concrete results and promising practices emerging from the HII on Localization, demonstrating how local implementation of the six transitions fosters integrated, inclusive, and impactful responses to global challenges.
- Foster multi-stakeholder dialogue on enabling environments for localization, with a particular focus on increasing capacity and mobilizing innovative and catalytic financing to scale up local action, unlock persistent bottlenecks, and drive forward inclusive implementation.
- Illustrate synergies among the High Impact Initiative on Localization and other High-Impact Initiatives to foster systemic transformation and collaboration among UN Agencies, governments, and stakeholders.

#### **Expected Outcomes**

To highlight progress under the High Impact Initiative (HII), the United Nations Local2030 Coalition is collecting results-driven stories and evidence of local action that drives territorial transformation for sustainable development, delivering systemic





impact and improving people's lives. This event will serve as a platform to receive these contributions.

Contributions from the special event will be featured in a report of the High-Impact Initiative on Localization developed by the Local2030 Coalition to:

- **Demonstrate how SDG localization in fostering systemic transformation** through the six transitions, and addressing persistent barriers through bold, locally driven solutions.
- Show how innovative policies, financing mechanisms, and partnerships have enabled effective SDG localization, particularly in alignment with the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs under review at the 2025 HLPF (SDGs 3, 5, 8, 14, and 17).
- Produce a set of actionable policy recommendations and scalable strategies that have proven catalytic and cross-cutting impacts across the SDG framework.
- Contribute to relevant global processes in 2025 and 2026 to deliver a surge of
  capacities at the local level that can be showcased at the 2027 SDG Summit.
  This would reinforce the role of localization as a key driver of inclusion, equity,
  and resilience in future global agendas—particularly in the countdown to 2030.
